It is published at <http://www.atax.unsw.edu.au/atta/jatta/index.htm> (ISSN: 1832-911X). The Association is a non-profit interdisciplinary organisation established in 1987. Our members include taxation law, accounting and economics academics, writers and administrators from Australia and New Zealand. JATTA is normally published annually and subsequent to the Association's annual conference. It is common for each issue of JATTA to be based on a theme for which a specific call for papers will be made.

EDITORSHIP OF JATTA

The editorship of JATTA rotates annually. The Editor(s) is a member of ATTA. Usually, the Editor(s) is the convenor of the annual ATTA conference in the relevant year. See the JATTA website for further information concerning the Editorial Board.

SUBMISSIONS

JATTA publishes articles of between 8,000 – 12,000 words in length. There is no prescribed number of articles for each issue of JATTA. All submissions should be made by email in double spaced 12 point Times Roman font. An Abstract of approximately 100 words should be submitted on a separate page.

Papers presented at the ATTA Annual Conference are eligible for submission for publication in JATTA, subject to editorial discretion and to the peer review process.
